Civil Air Patrol's Cadet of the Year: Cadet Col. Jenna Jones

A member of the Colorado Wing's Air Academy Cadet Squadron since February 2016, Cadet Col. Jenna Jones used her leadership, people skills, and work ethic as positive influences on her fellow cadets as the unit's cadet commander. The squadron flourished under her command despite setbacks presented by COVID-19 restrictions.



"As a leader, my focus is to be approachable and encourage teamwork while

modeling the core values," Jones said. "I set this standard as I lead by example, serving those around me and being aware of their wellbeing."

Jones served as the Rocky Mountain Region representative on CAP's National Cadet Advisory Council and was cadet commander of the 2021 Colorado Wing Encampment.

Her natural leadership abilities and determination helped her lead the cadet competition team to first place in the Colorado Wing. She learned cybersecurity skills and captained the squadron's varsity team, leading it to victory in the state competition and qualifying for the national competition.

Her accomplishments are also reflected in her high school career. Jones was an Air Force Junior ROTC commander at Air Academy High School and a member of the Kitty Hawk Air Society, representing 20% of Junior ROTC cadets academically. She maintained a 4.68 GPA with a rigorous academic schedule including Advanced Placement courses in calculus, English, U.S. history and U.S. government and politics.

Jones attended the CAP National Cyber Defense Training Academy and National Blue Beret, one of CAP's signature cadet activities, held in conjunction with EAA AirVenture, the nation's largest air show.

"Civil Air Patrol has had such an impact on my life. I would not be who I am today without the cadet program," she said. "It has challenged me physically, mentally, and socially and has given me the opportunity to continuously push myself out of my comfort zone."

Jones is now a student at Norwich University in Vermont, majoring in computer security and information assurance. Her plans include attending law school and potentially commissioning into the U.S. Air Force.

"I plan to stay involved in Civil Air Patrol as a cadet in Vermont while attending college," she said, adding, "The best part of Civil Air Patrol, at least to me, is the community that it builds."

"No matter where I go across the nation, I know that there is a strong connection among Civil Air Patrol members."

Saturday, 4 June, 2022 saw more than 100 cadets from the Colorado Wing and over a dozen other states, arrive at the United States Air Force Academy (USAFA) Preparatory School in Colorado Springs, Colorado. They were there for the long-awaited start of the 2022 Colorado Wing Encampment, a pivotal leadership learning opportunity for cadets every year. In keeping with COWG's tradition of naming encampments after notable USAF aircraft, this year's encampment was dubbed the "Hustler" Encampment, by Cadet Lt. Col. Carolyn Kimzey, cadet commander, in honor of the USAF's B-58 "Hustler" cold-war, supersonic, nuclear bomber.



The 2022 encampment was the realization of quite a long buildup of anticipation, as COVID-19 concerns sidelined the yearly tradition, along with the vital role it plays in the leadership development of the wing's finest cadets, for the past two years. In the absence of being able to hold encampments, specialized waivers during heightened

COVID restrictions allowed some cadets to receive their Billy Mitchell awards and promote into the cadet officer grades without previously fulfilling the requirement to attend an encampment. This led to an unusual situation at the 2022 encampment, with several student cadets attending their first

encampment as Cadet Officers! In the face of this unusual circumstance, a particular emphasis, especially during PIPER, (preliminary staff training in the days leading up to encampment), was placed on the fact that all student cadets at encampment, regardless of grade in the cadet program, are considered on equal footing as members of their flight under the close mentorship of their duly appointed flight staff. Because of the diversity of skills and experience of the cadet students, this Encampment had an emphasis on 'back to basics', so that students could return to their squadrons with the consistent and practiced foundations to help bring their squadrons back to CAP national standards.

This year also served as the first COWG Encampment in recent memory to hold all daily meals at the iconic Mitchell Hall, the Air Force Academy's cadet area dining facility. The opportunity to be apart of regular USAFA cadet life was a great bonus for these CAP cadets.

The bulk of cadet cadre arrived 3 days before the true start of encampment for the 'PIPER' pre-training activity. After making the best possible use of this advanced prep time, the Encampment cadet cadre received the student cadets on in-processing day ready to guide them through their encampment rigors.

This first day largely focused on the essentials such as safety and broad expectations, as well as assessing the initial skills of newly-arrived cadet-students.

Day 2, Sunday, gave the students interested a chance to attend worship services, and served as an intense day of training on the skills of drill, uniform and barracks expectations.

Day 3, Monday, allowed the competition between flights to take shape as students tested their aerospace acumen in the Aerospace Knowledge Bowl, from which Alpha flight emerged victorious.

Day 4, Tuesday, continued this flight rivalry with squadron volleyball tournaments. Echo flight won the championship game on Friday. Students were also treated to a surprise visit from USAFA's Falcon mascots and their handlers.

Starting on Wednesday, squadrons 1 and 2 split up for exciting and memorable tour days; Squadron 1 spent Wednesday building team leadership skills at the USAFA ropes course and touring cadet area facilities and aerospace labs.

Squadron 2's Wednesday itinerary took them to Peterson Space Force Base for a day of immersive military aviation activities including rides in a CH-47 Chinook Helicopter!

Thursday, the squadrons swapped itineraries. Unfortunately, the Chinook flying arrangement was not available, so instead COWG pilots rallied CAP aircraft for orientation flights for all cadets while squadron 2 got their turn at the ropes course and cadet area tours.

Friday brought the encampment back together for the Challenge Run, to the highest point on the USAFA grounds. A perfect culmination of their team-building development, each flight showed their team spirit in cheers and marching 'jodies' as they ran up and hiked back.

A celebration evening brought guest lectures by Maj. Rochelle Kimbrell (USAF, Ret., the USAF's first African-American female fighter pilot) and LtCol. Dan Hampton (USAF, Ret., combat veteran F-16 pilot and bestselling author) as well as an awards ceremony to recognize the standout flights and cadets in several categories:

- Alpha Flight awarded Spirit Flight and Knowledge Bowl winners
- Bravo awarded Shark Flight for their competitive reputation
- Echo awarded volleyball champions

THE GENERAL CARL A. SPAATZ AWARD is Civil Air Patrol's highest cadet honor. It is presented to cadets who have demonstrated excellence in leadership, character, fitness, and aerospace education. Cadets qualify for this prestigious award after devoting an average of four years to progress through sixteen achievements in the CAP Cadet Program. Along the way they develop self-discipline, a strong sense of personal responsibility, the ability to lead and persuade, and the foundation necessary for pursuing a career in aviation, space, or technology.

The final step a cadet must complete to earn the Spaatz Award is a rigorous four-part exam consisting of a challenging physical fitness test, an essay exam testing their moral reasoning, a comprehensive written exam on leadership, and a comprehensive written exam on aerospace education. Upon passing the Spaatz Award exams, the cadet is promoted to the grade of cadet colonel.

The Spaatz Award is named in honor of Carl "Tooey" Spaatz, the first Chief of Staff of the United States Air Force. One of the giants in the history of airpower, in 1929 Spaatz, together with another pilot, set an important flight endurance record of 150 hours and 40 minutes in the early days of aviation. During World War II, he commanded the Allied air campaign against the Nazis. In the Pacific Theater, the atomic bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki took place under his command. After retiring from the Air Force, General Spaatz served as the first chairman of Civil Air Patrol National Board.

Since the award's inception in 1964, Civil Air Patrol has presented the Spaatz Award to only 2410 cadets nation-wide, representing less than 1% of CAP cadets. Spaatz Cadets are expected to serve as role models for junior cadets, and become leaders in their communities as they enter adulthood. The first recipient of the Spaatz Award, Michigan's Douglas C. Roach, served as a pilot with the Air Force Thunderbirds.

Utah Wing's Hess Named Next Rocky Mountain Region Commander

Hess, the Utah Wing commander since March 2021, will succeed Col. Jeffrey L. Johnson, Rocky Mountain Region commander for the past three years. He will be sworn in Oct. 8 at the Utah Wing Headquarters.

"Col. Hess has an effective leadership style that has produced excellent results and will be an amazing fit for the Rocky Mountain Region," Phelka said. "His experience in multiple mission areas and the spirit of collaboration he brings make him a valuable asset to the CSAG team as well."





CSAG stands for the Civil Air Patrol Senior Advisory Group, which advises the national commander and recommends policy and proposes constitution and bylaws changes to CAP's Board of Governors. It consists of the national commander, national vice commander, national executive officer, and the organization's eight region commanders, as well as two nonvoting members, the chief operating officer and the CAP-U.S. Air Force commander.

Hess, who resides in West Jordan, Utah, has served in Civil Air Patrol for 19 years — five as an Ohio Wing cadet and 14 as a senior member in the Utah Wing. He has a history of effective command and staff experience at the wing level, starting as director of information technology (2008-2017), director of operations (2010-2017), government relations adviser (2017-2021), vice commander (2017-2021), and commander (2021-2022).



"I am humbled, honored, and inspired by this opportunity to lead the exceptional volunteers of the Rocky Mountain Region," Hess said. "I look forward to serving our cadets and senior members as we build on the region's proud heritage together and explore opportunities to collaborate, innovate, and excel."

The Rocky Mountain Region includes more than 4,000 members and consists of the Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Utah, and Wyoming wings.

As Utah Wing commander for the past 18 months and wing vice commander the four years before that, Hess has put his professional budget and acquisition experience to use managing state appropriations, U.S. Air Force-assigned missions, and wing budgets. He has served on the wing finance committee the past six years.

Previously, as the wing's director of operations, he led all communications, emergency services, and operations, and he established strong relationships with the state director of aeronautics and state emergency management staff.





"Participating in Civil Air Patrol both as a cadet and as a senior volunteer has been one of the largest contributors to my successes in life. Ingrained into my everyday living, the cadet program and core values laid a foundation of service that continues to resonate deeply with me," Hess said.

"I feel that serving as the region commander, I can further a transference of knowledge and spirit of volunteerism in cadets and senior members alike," he added. "I am passionate about Civil Air Patrol and the power each volunteer has in them to make the whole of CAP a premier service organization."

A CAP-rated and Federal Aviation Administration commercial pilot, Hess has participated in numerous aerospace

education and civic activities. He is a West Jordan City Airport Advisory Board member as well as an experimental aircraft builder, a small Unmanned Aerial Systems (sUAS) pilot, and a Level 2 High Power Certified Member with the National Association of Rocketry.





An Eagle Scout and varsity coach/scoutmaster, Hess is also a life member of the National Eagle Scout Association, the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association, and the Experimental Aircraft Association.





Civil Air Patrol Launches Bold New Logo

Civil Air Patrol is being transformed. Its level of sophistication has advanced significantly in recent years. For example, CAP's fleet is being transformed from" steam gauges" to glass cockpits that can be programmed to display and to fly CAP search grids. In fact, CAP no longer needs to wait for the weather to break or for the sun to rise to begin a search – we can start in minutes, using cellphone forensics and radar analysis.

A similar level of sophistication touches every aspect of Civil Air Patrol – IT (Innovation), philanthropy (the CAP Foundation), cadet programs (Cadet Interactive), aerospace education (STEM — science, technology, engineering, and math), member education and training (Volunteer University), chaplain corps (resiliency programs), and now marketing too.

Over the past two years, Marketing and Strategic Communications (MAC) has been working to better align the CAP brand as a Total Force partner. The U.S. Air Force auxiliary's new logo tells a brand story about aviation, volunteerism, partnership, and heritage and projects a more youthful, modern, Air Force-style look.

CAP's Board of Governors voted unanimously April 23 to adopt the new logo, which "accomplishes several things and includes some unique benefits," said Randy Bolinger, chief of marketing and communications.

"The bottom line is, we are not Civil Air Patrol of the 1940s, and the new corporate identity makes that obvious," Bolinger said.



Out With the Old

The Office of Civilian Defense, the basis for the original Civil Air Patrol symbol, was disbanded in 1945. Since that time, CAP has been associated with something that has long since been defunct.

"From a brand perspective, being associated with something that is obsolete is not a strong brand position" Bolinger said.

"Imagine General Motors spending billions of dollars to build and name a state-of the-art stadium in Detroit. Now imagine that GM chose to name the stadium the Oldsmobile Center, after a product line that was discontinued decades ago.

"True, the Oldsmobile Center name would be a wonderful tribute to a discontinued product line. that resonates with people nostalgic about the Cutlass, 442, Delta 88, and Tornado. But using the name of an obsolete product line does nothing to advance today's innovative General Motors working toward an all-electric product line by 2035," Bolinger said.

That logic applies to Civil Air Patrol as well, he said. "The triblade symbol from the Civilian Defense glory days of World War II is a wonderful tribute to our past, but that symbol has



precious little relevance today and does not accurately reflect the extent that CAP has evolved in the past 80 years.

"Simply stated, brands that don't evolve, lose relevance," he said. "While Oldsmobile was the first auto manufacturer to offer an automatic transmission and produced some of the best-selling models, that amazing legacy couldn't keep the brand from losing both its popularity over time and its demographic until GM ceased production of the once-beloved Oldsmobile."

Similarly, each new generation of CAP cadet becomes farther removed from any emotional attachment with World War II and Civilian Defense. Other than the emotional equity and nostalgic qualities of the triblade, the triblade symbol from a bygone era has no relevance in today's CAP.

"Is the triblade symbol cool – kind of in a mid-20th century retro design way? Does it reflect today's CAP? Not really – it's a heritage piece that should be set aside to make room for something that reflects the dynamic nature of today's CAP," Bolinger said.

Some Borrowed, Something Blue

"Most corporations update visual identities (a logo) periodically as a brand management best practice," he said. "Doing so reflects change — change in ownership, technology, direction, products, etc. CAP recently

updated an obsolete mission statement to accurately reflect who we are today.



"And who we are today, and since 2015, is a Total Force partner of the Air Force, not part of Civil Defense."

Until the turn of the century, Air Force went through a 60-year stretch without modernizing its logo. Today's Air Force logo is a moreUSAF logos accurate representation of a modern air force.

"While the Air Force beat CAP to the modernization wake-up call by more than two decades, CAP can now benefit from being able to take some visual cues from the Air Force logo to incorporate into our own," Bolinger said.

"The new CAP logo is clearly in the same Air Force Total Force family, having borrowed inspiration from the wing shape and hiding the legacy shape (the Civilian Defense triangle) in the negative space as the Air Force did with the star and globe.

"We also added something blue – the logo color itself that closely aligns with the Air Force. In fact, the Air Force and CAP logos nest together quite nicely as if they are, well, partners."

Best of Both Worlds

Regarding logo changes as part of brand refresh effort, love it, hate it, or undecided, there's good news for all – the triblade lives on. While the new corporate logo (the "Flying V") becomes the external persona of a Total Force partner, the triblade will remain part of CAP's identity system in the command emblem used on aircraft,



vehicles, flight suits, and countless more applications. Further, the triblade will remain the heart of the CAP seal.

CAP's **Brand Portal** provides high-resolution versions of the logo, instruction for proper use, new business card templates, website graphics, presentation templates, virtual backgrounds, and much more.

CAP Cadet Becomes Air Force Trailblazer Then Returns to CAP

flight orientation pilot she encourages

young men and women of all backgrounds to embrace aviation.

Kimbrell is an inspiration to many of all ages and continues to make a difference in others' lives. She especially enjoys speaking with young people who may not realize the sky's the limit until they meet her. She said, "I literally see the lights turn on in kids' eyes when I talk to them as they realize that someone like me can do something as cool as being a fighter pilot. They come to see that they can go out and do whatever they want to

do. That's what I focus on and what I think is really important. CAP can help achieve dreams."

Recently, Kimbrell was asked to take part in a Discovery Channel CuriosityStream documentary on Bessie Coleman, the first Black woman to earn a pilot's license. Kimbrell had a chance to talk about her early interest in aviation and the opportunities provided to her as a CAP cadet. There's also footage of her piloting an orientation flight with a female Colorado Wing cadet.



About CAP

Civil Air Patrol is congressionally chartered and operates as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation. CAP performs services for the federal government as the official civilian auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force and for states and local communities as a nonprofit organization. CAP is made up of eight geographic regions consisting of 52 wings (the 50 states, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia). It is a strategic partner of the Air Force, serving as a member of its Total Force. CAP has three core programs — Emergency Services, Cadet Programs, and Aerospace Education.



Transporting Vaccines - Civil Air Patrol supported Operation Warp Speed to expedite delivery of coronavirus vaccines to Americans, many in hardhit locations more easily accessible through CAP's fleet of single-engine aircraft. CAP's participation in the federal effort freed other agencies' assets to be allocated elsewhere.

Providing COVID Support

Civil Air Patrol's response to the COVID-19 pandemic has become the organization's largest mobilization since World War II. Over the past two years, more than 40 CAP wings have been tasked with COVID-related duties, such as delivering personal protective equipment, building temporary hospitals and other facilities, staffing emergency operations centers, delivering or serving meals, hauling mobile command centers, expediting test samples to labs, and using unit locations for blood drives, as well as delivering vaccines. In all, CAP members have contributed more than 40,000 volunteer days in response to the pandemic.






