This will be my final time to speak with you as your Wing Commander and I wanted to let you know that it has been an honor and privilege to serve with you over the last four years. To say that the last four years have been challenging is an understatement, but I am very proud of all that we have accomplished.

Three months after taking command, COVID drastically



disrupted every aspect of our lives. What originally started as a few weeks to flatten the curve, led to lockdowns, disruptions and worst of all, the loss of those close to us. Throughout the pandemic, the Colorado Wing persevered and our members' innovation was crucial to our continued operation. That operation was necessary when called upon to deliver critical supplies to our rural hospitals resulting in countless lives being saved.

We made dramatic changes in the way we operated as a wing. We onboarded a new wing administrator and reorganized our financial processes. We made drastic changes in operations that focused on aligning with the state and expanding our outreach to SAR organizations. That all paid off just a few weeks ago when an aircrew from the Black Sheep Squadron located three lost campers, earning the wing's first saves in many years.

Whether it's chairing the National Cadet Advisory Council, leading National Cadet Special Activities or winning National Cadet of the Year, our cadets are excelling and our cadet program is recognized as one of the top in the country. A special thanks goes out to all our senior members who step up to help with the cadet program. You all create the environment that allows our cadets to thrive.

Next Colorado Wing Commander Selected





Broomfield Composite Squadron Represents RMR at NCC



Cadet 2nd Lt. William H. Chen's academic achievements left him with even more potential paths to choose from than most graduating high school seniors face as they head into the summer.



The Colorado Wing cadet, after all, had to choose from appointments to the U.S. Air Force, U.S. Military, and U.S. Navy academies as well as acceptances to study biology at UCLA and at Texas A&M and

biomedical engineering at Northwestern University, along with full-ride scholarships from Air Force ROTC and Navy ROTC.



Chen wound up going with the Air Force Academy. During cadet basic training he served as guidon bearer for the Flying Tigers Squadron's Charlie Flight.



Chen has been a Civil Air Patrol member since November 2016, when he joined the Mustang Cadet Squadron less than a month after turning 12.

In addition to his nearly seven years in CAP, Chen was involved with 4-H Shooting Sports, the Boy Scouts of America (STEM Scouts, Scouting, Venturing, and Sea Scouts), and the U.S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps.

He achieved the rank of Eagle Scout and was also a NRA Distinguished Expert in Rifle, NRA Expert in Pistol, and Sea Cadet petty officer second class.

He served as a flight commander for the Mustang squadron and was a member of the team that competed in the 2022 National Cadet Competition after winning performances at the Colorado Wing and Rocky Mountain Region levels.

As a student at Cherry Creek High School, he competed on the football, swim, volleyball, and track and field teams.

Chen graduated with a grade-point average of 4.474 after taking a dozen Advanced Placement courses. He also attended summer seminars at the Naval, Air Force, and U.S. Coast Guard academies.

Outgoing 1st Air Force Commander Flies with CAP

After a distinguished 35-year career in the U.S. Air Force, the first 1st Air Force commander to officially fly with Civil Air Patrol is retiring.

Lt. Gen. Kirk Pierce will step down March 31 from his post as commander, Continental U.S. North American Aerospace Defense Command Region, 1st Air Force (Air Forces Northern and Air Forces Space), in a change of command with his successor.

Pierce retires with more than 5,000 flight hours in a variety of Air Force aircraft, along with Civil Air Patrol's Cessna 182T at Tyndall Air Base, Florida, and Cessna 206 at Maxwell Air Force Base. Tyndall is home to First Air Force and Maxwell to CAP National Headquarters.

Flying with CAP began nearly two years ago, and he has already accumulated about 140 hours of flight time in the Air Force auxiliary's Cessnas.

"It gives me a great opportunity to get out and fly," Pierce said. "I went out and flew with the Civil Air Patrol [CAP-USAF] team in Colorado Springs, which was awesome! It's a big part of our command, and I'm really excited about doing it."

Like the true leader he is, Pierce didn't skip any steps despite his rank.

"I went through all the training, took a check ride, and did a mission check in it, so I'm no different than anybody else," he said, describing the opportunity as "a side benefit" of commanding First Air Force, which oversees Civil Air Patrol.

"We have three aircraft out in front of our headquarters — a CAP 182, an F-15, and an F-16 — and as far as I can tell I'm the only one that has had a mission check in all three of those aircraft," he said.

Even though the aircraft Pierce has flown in the Air Force, primarily trainers and fighters, and CAP planes are quite different, "flying is flying," Pierce said.

"It's having a crosscheck and thinking ahead of the plane, watching the weather and watching things that change," he explained. "Every time you get complacent, that's when something changes significantly, especially on the ground like a taxiway, or weather happens. Whatever, it's the same skillset, just different speeds."

What is the significance of the general's time in CAP aircraft?

"I think it's a couple of things," Pierce said. "One, I get to understand better. If you're flying the aircraft and you're hanging out with them, both on the CAP-USAF, the active-duty side with the reservists and Civil Air Patrol, all the great volunteers here in America that are doing that job, it lets me have more than just an affinity for it.

"That I can actually go fly and see what they go through, see what aircraft the Air Force helps provides for them, what upgrades are done, like the avionics are great and all these details. It helps me see the maintenance and how well the aircraft are kept up or not kept up. In our case, they're kept up great so it's a good news story."


And the other side of flying with CAP?

"It does afford me the opportunity to get out and show the Civil Air Patrol brand to everybody and help the CAP national commander, Maj. Gen. Edward D. Phelka, as he continues the campaign to gain awareness and help people understand all the great things that CAP does.


"I'll show up somewhere with a small runway, FBO (fixed-base operator), drop in like Calhoun County and pump my own gas and they're like, 'Oh, you're a three-star and you're here by yourself. What are you doing, what's CAP, what does Civil Air Patrol do?' It helps facilitate telling the story in a lot of ways. I think it's awesome."

Sharing the Civil Air Patrol story will continue for Pierce when he retires from the Air Force, as he intends to fly with CAP's Colorado Wing as a civilian.

"As the First Air Force commander, CAP is one of our key mission enablers with them being one of the largest fleets of single-engine piston aircraft in the world, with 540 planes available, plus 54 gliders. In the past year, they flew more than 70,000 hours in Air Force-assigned missions for us as the official U.S. Air Force auxiliary," he said.

Black Sheep Squadron Aircrew Finds Lost Campers

Kudos to the Colorado Wing's Black Sheep Squadron aircrew who was credited by the AFRCC with three finds and three saves for locating three missing campers in Larimer County after being requested to assist the Larimer County Sheriff's Office with an aerial search on July 30th. The Black Sheep Squadron aircrew remained above the site to direct a Lifeline helicopter to the rescue landing zone. The official news release follows:

Larimer County, Colorado (July 31, 2023) — An aircrew with Civil Air Patrol's Colorado Wing



located three missing campers and guided ground searchers to the trio July 30, the day after they were reported missing from a group of five camping in the Tom Bennet Campground area near Pingree Park. The wing was assigned to participate in the mission after the Larimer County Sheriff's Office requested assistance from the Air Force Rescue Coordination Center for an aerial search. After the three wandered from their campsite area the evening of July 29, the two remaining campers were unable to get in contact with them with darkness approaching. The Colorado Wing received the assignment at 11 p.m. The aircrew

launched at first light the next morning.

The aircrew spotted one of the missing campers shortly after 9 a.m. and provided coordinates to sheriff's office searchers on the ground. About 10:30 a.m. the aircrew located the other two missing campers and directed Larimer County Search and Rescue ground team to the site. One of the three was able to hike out without assistance. The other two were transported over the steep, rough terrain in a LifeLine helicopter directed to the landing zone by the Colorado Wing aircrew. "The Colorado Wing continues to put practice to good use coordinating closely with local authorities who serve and protect to save those in distress," said Lt. Col. Hank Eng, Civil Air Patrol mission incident commander and the wing's emergency services officer. "CAP is proud to partner with first responders wherever and whatever the need."



On Wings Like Eagles....

With only one CAP Glider in the Colorado Wing, an experienced team of 3 CAP Glider pilots and two volunteer tow pilots from close by Black Forest Soaring Club, accomplished an incredible number of sorties (flights) in just 2 days. Using the Air Force Academy's Davis Field in Colorado Springs, thirty-five sorties, (3 were check/training rides, 32 were Cadet Orientation flights.) were flown on a beautiful weekend in mid-May. But the logistics were months in the making.

With invaluable support from the 306th Flight Training Group at USAFA, the team was able to use the airfield for the entire two days of flying. It was the first time in decades a CAP aircraft had flown out of USAFA. (WWII photo) Davis Airfield offers three runways – making an efficient operation for both the glider and tow pilots for take-offs, landings and the USAFA Aero Club, which operated off the East runway. Tow pilots included John Gillis (shown in photograph with Glider pilot Lt. Col. Dick Eason and PPCS Ops Officer, Capt. Owen Andrusiak) and Bill Gerblick, flying a Piper Pawnee PA-25.





Glider pilots for the weekend included Lt. Col. Dick Eason, 2nd Lt. John Norton and Lt. Col. Patrick Moylan – half of the wing's glider team with Program Officer, Maj. Dan Kubitchek, Lt. Col. Jer Eberhard and Capt. Bob Lynn.

While the glider program is logistically complex (tow aircraft and pilot required), **flying gliders teaches the fundamentals of flying**. The principal difference between an airplane and a glider is **its power source**. Whereas an airplane has an internal combustion engine that generates the power to propel it forward and to generate lift, a glider has no engine, and requires a tow aircraft to get to altitude.

The glider program offers the best opportunity for cadets and pilots to be introduced to the purest form of flight – all air, wind, and weather creating lift. With a focus on stick and rudder skills, eye/hand coordination and aviation weather – a person is learning mother nature's air flow.

Speaking with CAP pilot Lt. Col. Dick Eason, a retired Navy pilot, with years of experienced in powered aircraft and helicopters, he recalled using knowledge about aviation weather learned in gliders in a trip to Lake Tahoe in a Piper Dakota. A high-density altitude environment with mountain ridges, the Tahoe airport sits in a valley. Often powered aircraft must circle over a nearby golf course repeatedly to gain altitude. However, with the wind out of the west, Dick was able to climb straight out, at about 1000 ft/min, knowing the environment and using ridge lift, outclimbing aircraft that had taken off prior and were still circling to climb.

The design of the glider maximizes its mission – high efficiency and maneuverability. Pilots routinely





must understand any aircraft's glide ratio, L/D (lift over drag), for landing and even more so for choosing potential emergency landing opportunities. In comparison, Dick shared at 1 mile up, the helicopter has about a 1 to 2 miles (can't glide very far!). Our CAP 182's can glide about 6 to 8 miles. The glider, which has the highest glide ratio can glide for up to 36 miles!

The distance a glider can fly is limited by the available lift along an intended course. Training flights usually occur near the airport and often do not exceed 5-15 miles and are very safe. Per Wikipedia, "If you could extrapolate single mode pilot certificate counts to a common usage basis, **flying a glider is 2.5x safer than flying an airplane**, but of course you can't. However, the NTSB accident count for 2017 shows 56x more airplane accidents and 90x more fatal airplane accidents than glider accidents".

Dick referenced one of his most memorable glider flights flying in a Wyoming Wing event. Two ASKs were up flying in a thermal and were joined by a Red-Tailed hawk – flying the same thermal! A glider flight is an experience not to be missed. Cadets and seniors can learn stick and rudder skills and a tremendous amount about aviation weather. In a glider, having wings like eagles (or a hawk) is a wonderfully quiet, exhilarating experience and great fun.


In Memoriam

The COWG bid farewell to Lt. Col. Gene Munson who passed unexpectedly on July 5th. Col. Munson was one of the wing's beloved longtime members and a dear friend and colleague to many.

Lt. Col. Munson was a decorated Vietnam era Air Force veteran and having served in Civil Air Patrol since 2002, held technician, senior and master ratings in multiple CAP specialty tracks, received numerous service awards. Over his 21-year tenure in CAP he was appointed to various leadership and staff positions at the squadron, group, wing and region levels. He was also a valued member of the COWG Public Affairs team and regularly contributed articles to *Peaks & Planes* magazine. - Learn about all the aerospace experiences available through Civil Air Patrol that can provide growth to elevate their future.



COWG Members Participate in General Rose Statue Ceremony

COWG cadets and senior members participated in the General Maurice Rose statue dedication ceremony in Denver on the grounds of the state capitol on April 16th.

Major General Maurice Rose is the most decorated battle tank commander in American history and the highest ranking Jewish soldier in World War II. He grew up in Denver in a prominent Jewish family and dropped out of high school to join the military. Rose served with valor in both World Wars, killed in action while leading his men from the front in 1945. He was the highest-ranking officer to be killed in Europe in World War II.

General Dwight D. Eisenhower said that "Rose was not only one of our bravest and best, but was a leader who inspired his men to speedy accomplishment of tasks that to a lesser man would have seemed impossible."

The General Rose Monument, created by renowned Colorado sculptor George Lundeen, honors a Colorado hero that the entire nation can look to as a point of pride and inspiration.



CAP Cadet Becomes Air Force Trailblazer Then Returns to CAP

Retired U.S. Air Force Lt. Col.
Rochelle Kimbrell got her start as a Civil Air Patrol cadet in the Colorado Wing's Parker Composite Squadron.
She received an appointment to the Air Force Academy and upon graduation proceeded to become the first female Black fighter pilot in the Air Force, serving as a trailblazer for generations to come. She retired after 22 years and then rejoined the Colorado Wing as a senior member. As a CAP lieutenant colonel and cadet flight orientation pilot she encourages

young men and women of all backgrounds to embrace aviation.

Kimbrell is an inspiration to many of all ages and continues to make a difference in others' lives. She especially enjoys speaking with young people who may not realize the sky's the limit until they meet her. She said, "I literally see the lights turn on in kids' eyes when I talk to them as they realize that someone like me can do something as cool as being a fighter pilot. They come to see that they can go out and do whatever they want to

do. That's what I focus on and what I think is really important. CAP can help achieve dreams."

Recently, Kimbrell was asked to take part in a Discovery Channel CuriosityStream documentary on Bessie Coleman, the first Black woman to earn a pilot's license. Kimbrell had a chance to talk about her early interest in aviation and the opportunities provided to her as a CAP cadet. There's also footage of her piloting an orientation flight with a female Colorado Wing cadet.
