

Leadership Presentation Guidelines

What to Include



Applicable Content

-Present about something that the audience can relate to (ex. teamwork in a group project)



Visuals

-Keep audience engaged with relevant pictures



Succinct Points

-Teach what you want to teach **directly**
-Don't ramble unnecessarily



Interactive Activities

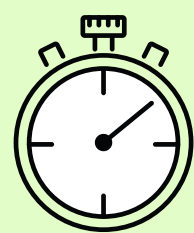
-Have interactive activities pertaining to the topic (ex. group discussions, Kahoot, Gimkit, Quizlet Live, etc)



Ask Questions

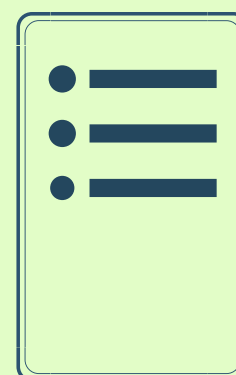
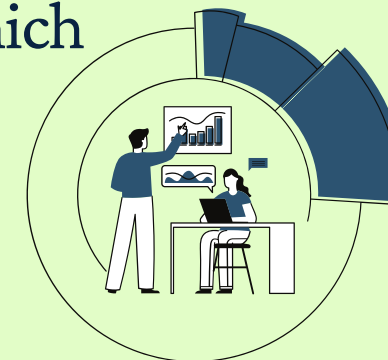
-Keep your audience engaged by asking questions
-Make sure your audience understands what is being presented

Keeping Engagement



-Try to limit your presentations to a maximum of 30-45 min

-Mix up the platforms on which you are presenting with, presentations do not always have to be on a slideshow



-Try to minimize how many words you have on slides or other platforms, use bullet points and elaborate to keep things concise

-**DO NOT** be the only speaker, have multiple voices be heard. One speaker presentations are lectures, which often leads to audience disengagement. Refer to [Learn to Lead Vol 2](#),
