1. Many local health departments have issued health orders that restrict indoor activities. The following Counties were placed by the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment (CDPHE) in a "Level Red" status as of 28 Nov 2020 and is subject to change.

2. All squadrons operating in a County having been placed under Level Red, must cease all indoor meetings and activities and are placed into Phase 0 of the COWG COVID remobilization plan. Once a county leaves Level Red, they revert to Phase 1 and previous guidance upon notification of the COWG COVID remobilization team.

3. COWG has suspended all non-mission essential activities in Level Red status counties. Per NHQ guidance, the wing commander can authorize activities and training that are considered mission critical. Mission critical activities allowed include real world missions, single pilot proficiency, A9 maintenance sorties, flight evaluations, other ES specialty training and renewals (outdoors with 10 or less individuals) and other activities approved by the wing commander.
